Terms and Conditions

How to Enter:

The CellScape Precise Spatial Proteomics (PSP) Grant Program begins on July 14, 2025 at 12:01 a.m. (ET) and ends on August 15, 2025 at 11:59 p.m. (PT); entries must be submitted during that period to be eligible. The contest is open to all researchers who meet the eligibility requirements, as defined below. To enter, participants must submit a short abstract application digitally at <https://go.brukerspatialbiology.com/CellScape-Precise-Spatial-Proteomics-Grant-Program.html>. The application must include: (1) the participant's full name, email address, telephone number and any other contact information required by Bruker Spatial Biology; (2) the name of the participant's institution or company; (3) a descriptive title for the proposed project; and (4) an abstract proposal (written in 250 words or less) demonstrating how the applicant will integrate the results to fuel their field of research. Applications become the property of Bruker Spatial Biology. Bruker Spatial Biology makes no guarantee or warranty with respect to the security or confidentiality of applications or the application process. By entering, the participant gives permission to Bruker Spatial Biology to contact the participant regarding Bruker Spatial Biology's products and services, whether or not the participant is chosen as the winner. Each participant shall be entitled to make one (1) entry into the CellScape PSP Grant Program only. In the event that Bruker Spatial Biology deems a participant to have made multiple applications to enter or to have acted in bad faith with respect to the CellScape PSP Grant Program, the participant shall be excluded from the CellScape PSP Grant Program and consequently ineligible to win the prize, as defined below.

Eligibility and Requirements:

Applicants must be actively enrolled or employed at an institution or company in a capacity in which they perform life science research. Recipients must be age 18 or older. Members of the immediate families of Bruker Spatial Biology (or its affiliates) employees and directors, and/or persons living in the same household as such persons, are ineligible to participate in this grant program. The CellScape PSP Grant Program is open to researchers who have not been the winner of another Bruker Spatial Biology contest or program in the past year. The grant award allows for one recipient each from the Americas, EMEA (Europe/Middle East/Africa), and APJ (Asia Pacific Japan) to receive 3 samples imaged and analyzed on the CellScape platform by Bruker Spatial Biology in either Saint Louis, MO, or Hannover, Germany.

Selection of Recipients and Notifications:

Bruker Spatial Biology will review and evaluate all of the grant applications submitted and will award the grant to the submission that Bruker Spatial Biology believes, based on the sole judgment and discretion of



Bruker Spatial Biology personnel evaluating the grant applications, will have the greatest scientific impact. All decisions by Bruker Spatial Biology with respect to such award will be final. The selected winners will be attempted to be notified by email within approximately five (5) business days after selection. If the selected winners have not responded to email inquiries within three (3) days, Bruker Spatial Biology will attempt to contact the winner by telephone. If the winner cannot be reached by telephone within forty-eight (48) hours of first telephone attempt to notify such winner, the prize may be forfeited and an alternate winner may be selected, based on the criteria set forth above, at Bruker Spatial Biology's discretion.

Use of Recipient's Name and Likeness:

The participant acknowledges and agrees that, if the participant is selected as one of the winners, the participant's name, biographical information, likeness, the name of the participant's institution or company and the project title (excluding further project details) may, without further compensation, be published on one or more Bruker Spatial Biology's website(s) and, at Bruker Spatial Biology's discretion, through social media. By accepting the prize, the winner grants to Bruker Spatial Biology, on behalf of the winner and the winner's institution or company, the right, at any time and from time to time, to print, publish, broadcast and use, worldwide and in any media now known or hereafter developed (including, but not limited to, social media, the Internet and the world wide web), the winning participant's name, biographical information, (if provided by the participant) image, likeness, the name of the winning participant's institution or company and the project title (excluding further project details).

Publications and Presentations:

It is the objective of both parties that the winners will present results from the proposed study in one or more publications, webinars, case studies, or other forms of scientific promotion. Further, as a condition of entry and award of the prize, Bruker Spatial Biology will be permitted to use such results to create marketing materials. Results of these studies are expected to lead ultimately to publications and will be presented in international conferences (e.g. AACR, SfN, for example).

Miscellaneous: By submitting an application, each applicant agrees that Bruker Spatial Biology may use his or her name, abstract title, and abstract for marketing purposes. All applicants agree that Bruker Spatial Biology may process the personal data he or she provides as part of the application, including sharing such data with Bruker Spatial Biology's partners, collaborators and other third parties who are obligated to keep the data confidential, and in accordance with Bruker Spatial Biology's privacy policies available at [Privacy Policy - Bruker Spatial Biology](#). Award recipients may be required to sign and return an affidavit of eligibility, release of liability, a publicity release, and other appropriate legal documentation reasonably requested by Bruker Spatial Biology.
